



PUBLIC NOTICE

The CITY OF FARMERSVILLE water systems PWS 0430004 has violated the monitoring and reporting requirements set by Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) in Title 30 Texas Administrative Code (30 TAC), section 290, Subchapter F. Public water systems are required to properly disinfect water before distribution, maintain acceptable disinfection residuals within the distribution system, monitor the disinfectant residual at various locations throughout the distribution system, and report the results of that monitoring to the TCEQ on a quarterly basis.

Results of regular monitoring are an indicator of whether or not your drinking water is safe from microbial contamination.

This violation occurred in the monitoring period Fourth Quarter 10/01/2014 – 12/31/2014.

We are taking the following actions to address this issue:

North Texas Municipal Water District treats our public water system before it gets to the City of Farmersville. **City of Farmersville monitors the disinfectant residual daily at various locations throughout the distribution system. The report of fourth quarter monitoring was turned in late to TCEQ. Since the report was turned in late this public notice is required.** At this time we are mailing out the notice of violation to all of billed customers, putting this notice on our website www.farmersvilletx.com, local newspaper and in a public place.

Please share this information with all people who drink this water, especially those who may not have received this notice directly (i.e., people in apartments, nursing homes, schools, businesses). You can do this by posting this notice in a place or distributing copies by hand or mail.
