AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF FARMERSVILLE, TEXAS, AMENDING THE CODE OF ORDINANCES, CITY OF FARMERSVILLE, TEXAS, AS HERETOFORE AMENDED, THROUGH THE AMENDMENT OF ARTICLE 10, "TRAFFIC CONTROL," BY AMENDING SECTION 10.119.3, "AREAS DESIGNATED AS LOADING ZONE," BY DELETING SECTION 10.119.3 IN ITS ENTIRETY AND REPLACING SECTION 10.119.3 WITH A NEW SECTION 10.119.3, ENTITLED, "AREAS DESIGNATED AS LOADING ZONE" AND BY AMENDING AND MODIFYING THE MAP CONTAINED IN SECTION 10.119.4, ENTITLED "MAP OF RESTRICTED PARKING," TO REFLECT THE REVISIONS MADE TO SECTION 10.119.3 BY THIS ORDINANCE; BY AMENDING SECTION 10.119.6, "PARKING PROHIBITED," BY DELETING SECTION 10.119.6 IN ITS ENTIRETY AND REPLACING SECTION 10.119.6 WITH A NEW SECTION 10.119.6, ENTITLED, "PARKING PROHIBITED"; BY AMENDING SECTION 10.122.3, "EXEMPTIONS," BY DELETING SECTION 10.122.3 IN ITS ENTIRETY; REPEALING ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT HEREWITH; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; PROVIDING FOR GOVERNMENTAL IMMUNITY; PROVIDING FOR INJUNCTIONS; PROVIDING A PENALTY OR FINE NOT TO EXCEED THE SUM OF FIVE HUNDRED DOLLARS (\$500.00) FOR EACH OFFENSE; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the City of Farmersville, Texas ("City"), desires to eliminate the prohibition against overnight parking in the City parking lots situated north and south of the City Square; and

WHEREAS, the City desires to eliminate certain exemptions concerning the parking of trucks or trailers in excess of one (1) ton in particular areas; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Farmersville, Texas finds that all prerequisites to the adoption of this Ordinance have been met;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FARMERSVILLE, TEXAS, THAT:

SECTION 1. Findings Incorporated

All of the above premises are hereby found to be true and correct legislative and factual determinations of the City of Farmersville and they are hereby approved and incorporated into the body of this Ordinance as if copied in their entirety.

SECTION 2. Amendment of Article 10, "Traffic Control," by deleting Section 10.119.3 in its entirety and replacing Section 10.119.3 with a new Section 10.119.3, entitled, "Areas Designated as Loading Zone."

From and after the effective date of this Ordinance, Article 10, Section 10.119.3, of the Code of Ordinances, City of Farmersville, Texas, entitled, "Areas Designated as Loading Zone," is hereby deleted in its entirety and replaced with a new Section 10.119.6 to read as follows:

"Sec. 10.119.3. Areas Designated as Loading Zone

The following areas are hereby designated as a 15 Minute Loading Zone between the hours of 9:00 a.m. and 3:00 p.m. only:

- a. the west side of Main Street between Candy Street and McKinney Street, as indicated by yellow curb markings on the street in accordance with the map contained in Section 10.119.4; and,
- b. the east side of Main Street between College Street and McKinney Street, as indicated by yellow curb markings on the street in accordance with the map contained in Section 10.119.4.

At all other times no parking shall be allowed in these areas."

SECTION 3. Amendment of Article 10, "Traffic Control," by amending and modifying the map contained in Section 10.119.4, entitled "Map of Restricted Parking," to reflect the revisions made to Section 10.119.3 by this Ordinance.

From and after the effective date of this Ordinance, Article 10, Section 10.119.4, of the Code of Ordinances, City of Farmersville, Texas, entitled, "Map of Restricted Parking," shall be amended and modified to reflect the revisions made to Section 10.119.3 by this Ordinance.

SECTION 4. Amendment of Article 10, "Traffic Control," by deleting Section 10.119.6 in its entirety and replacing Section 10.119.6 with a new Section 10.119.6, entitled, "Parking Prohibited."

From and after the effective date of this Ordinance, Article 10, Section 10.119.6, of the Code of Ordinances, City of Farmersville, Texas, entitled, "Parking Prohibited," is hereby deleted in its entirety and replaced with a new Section 10.119.6 to read as follows:

"Sec. 10.119.6. Parking Prohibited

It shall be unlawful and considered a violation of this Article for any person, corporation, partnership, or any other entity to allow any vehicle

owned by it to be parked or unattended anywhere along the 100 block of North Main Street.”

SECTION 5. Amendment of Article 10, “Traffic Control,” by deleting Section 10.122.3 in its entirety.

From and after the effective date of this Ordinance, Article 10, Section 10.122.3, of the Code of Ordinances, City of Farmersville, Texas, entitled, “Exemptions,” is hereby deleted in its entirety.

SECTION 6. Cumulative Repealer

This Ordinance shall be cumulative of all other Ordinances and shall not repeal any of the provisions of such Ordinances except for those instances where there are direct conflicts with the provisions of this Ordinance. Ordinances or parts thereof in force at the time this Ordinance shall take effect and that are inconsistent with this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent that they are inconsistent with this Ordinance. Provided however, that any complaint, action, claim or lawsuit which has been initiated shall continue to be governed by the provisions of such Ordinance and for that purpose the Ordinance shall remain in full force and effect.

SECTION 7. Savings

All rights and remedies of the City of Farmersville are expressly saved as to any and all violations of the provisions of any Ordinances which have accrued at the time of the effective date of this Ordinance; and, as to such accrued violations and all pending litigation, both civil and criminal, whether pending in court or not, under such Ordinances, same shall not be affected by this Ordinance but may be prosecuted until final disposition by the courts.

SECTION 8. Severability

It is hereby declared to be the intention of the City Council of the City of Farmersville that the phrases, clauses, sentences, paragraphs, and sections of this Ordinance are severable, and if any phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph, or section of this Ordinance should be declared unconstitutional by valid judgment or final decree of any court of competent jurisdiction, such unconstitutionality shall not affect any of the remaining phrases, clauses, sentences, paragraphs, or sections of this Ordinance, since the same would have been enacted by the City Council without incorporation in this Ordinance of any such unconstitutional phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph, or section.

SECTION 9. Governmental Immunity

All of the regulations provided in this ordinance are hereby declared to be governmental and for the health, safety and welfare of the general public. Any member

of the City Council or any City official or employee charged with the enforcement of this ordinance, acting for the City of Farmersville in the discharge of his/her duties, shall not thereby render himself/herself personally liable; and he/she is hereby relieved from all personal liability for any damage that might accrue to persons or property as a result of any act required or permitted in the discharge of his/her said duties.

SECTION 10. Injunctions

Any violation of this ordinance can be enjoined by a suit filed in the name of the City of Farmersville in a court of competent jurisdiction, and this remedy shall be in addition to any penal provision in this ordinance or in the Code of the City of Farmersville.

SECTION 11. Engrossment and Enrollment

The City Secretary of the City of Farmersville is hereby directed to engross and enroll this Ordinance by copying the exact Caption and the Effective Date clause in the minutes of the City Council of the City of Farmersville and by filing this Ordinance in the Ordinance records of the City.

SECTION 12. Penalty

Any person, firm or corporation violating any of the provisions or terms of this Ordinance or of the Code of Ordinances as amended hereby, shall be subject to the same penalty as provided for in the Code of Ordinances of the City of Farmersville, as previously amended, and upon conviction shall be punished by a fine not to exceed the sum of Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) for each offense.

SECTION 13. Effective Date

This Ordinance shall take effect immediately from and after its passage and publication of the caption as required by law.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF FARMERSVILLE, TEXAS, AMENDING THE CODE OF ORDINANCES, CITY OF FARMERSVILLE, TEXAS, AS HERETOFORE AMENDED, THROUGH THE AMENDMENT OF ARTICLE 4, "BUILDING AND CONSTRUCTION," BY AMENDING SECTION 4.105.7, ENTITLED "STREET NAMING AND PROPERTY NUMBERING PROCEDURES ARE STANDARDS AS AUTHORIZED IN THE COUNTY ROAD AND BRIDGE ACT (ART. 6702-1, TEXAS CIVIL STATUTES). THESE PROCEDURES WILL INCLUDE:," BY DELETING SUCH SECTION IN ITS ENTIRETY AND ADOPTING A NEW SECTION 4.105.7 ENTITLED "STREET NAMING AND PROPERTY NUMBERING PROCEDURES," BY AMENDING SECTION 4.105.9, "STREET NAMES ADOPTED," BY NAMING THE NEWLY ANNEXED PORTION OF COUNTY ROAD 610 BETWEEN COUNTY ROAD 611 AND U.S. HIGHWAY 380 AS COLLIN PARKWAY AND CHANGING THE CURRENT STREET NAMES OF THE 100 BLOCK OF SOUTH RIKE, THE 100 BLOCK OF AUSTIN, THE 100 BLOCK OF COLLIN, AND PROSPECT ALL IN ACCORDANCE WITH SECTION 4.105.2 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES, CITY OF FARMERSVILLE, TEXAS; REPEALING ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT HEREWITH; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; PROVIDING FOR GOVERNMENTAL IMMUNITY; PROVIDING FOR INJUNCTIONS; PROVIDING FOR NOTICE AND IMPLEMENTATION; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the current names of certain existing roadways are duplicate or similar sounding names that cause or may cause confusion; and

WHEREAS, the City desires to rename the current street names of the 100 block of South Rike, the 100 block of Austin, the 100 block of Collin, and Prospect to eliminate duplicate or similar sounding names; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Farmersville, Texas finds that all prerequisites to the adoption of this Ordinance have been met; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Farmersville, Texas finds that it is in the best interest of the public health, safety and welfare to rename these existing street segments;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FARMERSVILLE, TEXAS, THAT:

SECTION 1. Findings Incorporated

“Sec. 4.105.7. Street Naming and Property Numbering Procedures

- (A) Street naming and property numbering shall conform to the requirements set forth in this article, the City’s Subdivision Ordinance and the requirements of state law.
- (B) New address notification of any newly approved street name, change in street name or change in street addressing assignment must be presented to the owner(s) and tenant(s) of property affected by such change(s) in writing when the final determination of the street name and/or assignment of street address(es) occurs. Notification should also be provided to the U.S. Postal Service. The street name, street name change and/or assignment of street address becomes effective as provided in the ordinance approving such action.
- (C) The property owner and tenant are responsible for posting proper address number signage within thirty (30) days after the effective date of such change as described in the new address notification.
- (D) Maintenance of the City’s addressing procedure and the inventory of public streets will be the responsibility of the City Manager or his designee.”

SECTION 3. Amendment of Article 4, “Building and Construction,” by amending Section 4.105.9, “Street Names Adopted,” by naming the newly annexed portion of County Road 610 between County Road 611 and U.S. Highway 380 as Collin Parkway and changing the current street names of the 100 block of South Rike, the 100 block of Austin, the 100 block of Collin, and Prospect.

From and after the effective date of this Ordinance, Article 4, Section 4.105.9 of the Code of Ordinances, City of Farmersville, Texas, entitled, “Street Names Adopted,” is hereby amended in part by naming the newly annexed portion of County Road 610 between County Road 611 and U.S. Highway 380 as Collin Parkway and changing the current street names of the 100 block of South Rike, the 100 block of Austin, the 100 block of Collin, and Prospect and noting such changes in Section 4.105.9, in alphabetical order, to read as follows:

SECTION 3. Written Notice of Change in Street Name and Change in Signage

City staff shall provide written notice of the street name changes contained in Section 2, above, together with the effective date of such street name changes to the United States Postal Service, all emergency service providers and governmental entities within whose jurisdiction such properties are situated, and the owners and tenants of all properties affected by the foregoing street name changes. New signage reflecting the street name changes contained in Section 2, above, should be installed by the City within thirty (30) days following the effective date of this Ordinance.

SECTION 4. Cumulative Repealer

This Ordinance shall be cumulative of all other Ordinances and shall not repeal any of the provisions of such Ordinances except for those instances where there are direct conflicts with the provisions of this Ordinance. AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF FARMERSVILLE, TEXAS, AMENDING THE CODE OF ORDINANCES, CITY OF FARMERSVILLE, TEXAS, AS HERETOFORE AMENDED, THROUGH THE AMENDMENT OF ARTICLE 10, "TRAFFIC CONTROL," BY AMENDING SECTION 10.125, ENTITLED "SCHOOL ZONES ESTABLISHED," BY DELETING SECTION 10.125, INCLUDING SECTIONS 10.125.1 THROUGH 10.125.4, IN ITS ENTIRETY AND ADOPTING A NEW SECTION 10.125 ALSO ENTITLED "SCHOOL ZONES ESTABLISHED" DESIGNATING CERTAIN STREETS TO BE SITUATED WITHIN SCHOOL ZONES, DECLARING A REDUCTION OF THE PRIMA FACIE MAXIMUM SPEED LIMIT ON SUCH ENUMERATED STREETS AND THE TIME FRAMES FOR SUCH REDUCED SPEEDS, AND REGULATING AND CONTROLLING THE DIRECTION AND FLOW OF TRAFFIC ON SUCH STREETS DURING ACTIVE SCHOOL ZONE TIMES; REPEALING ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT HERewith; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; PROVIDING FOR GOVERNMENTAL IMMUNITY; PROVIDING FOR INJUNCTIONS; PROVIDING A PENALTY OR FINE NOT TO EXCEED THE SUM OF FIVE HUNDRED DOLLARS (\$500.00) FOR EACH OFFENSE; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the Texas Transportation Code establishes the prima facie maximum speed limit for highways and streets other than alleys within an urban area of the State of Texas; and

WHEREAS, the Texas Transportation Code grants to and recognizes the authority of Type A General Law Cities, such as the City of Farmersville, to regulate and control the streets and roadways within their corporate limits, to establish school zones, and to reduce the maximum prima facie speed limits on numbered highways that are a part of the Texas highway system and unnumbered roadways that are not a part of the Texas highway system; and

WHEREAS, the City of Farmersville has previously established certain school zones, regulated the direction, flow and parking of motor vehicles on streets in and about public school sites, and reduced the maximum prima facie speed limits on such streets during specific time frames for the protection of the public health, safety and welfare; and

WHEREAS, the City Council now desires to modify and amend those previously adopted regulations to better protect the residents of the City of Farmersville and particularly the health, safety and welfare of the children and young adults attending schools within the corporate limits of the City; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Farmersville, Texas finds that all prerequisites to the adoption of this Ordinance have been met; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Farmersville, Texas finds that it is in the best interest of the public health, safety and welfare to modify and amend the previously adopted regulations relating to school zones within the City of Farmersville;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FARMERSVILLE, TEXAS, THAT:

"Sec. 10.125. School Zones Established

Sec. 10.125.1. Vehicle Speed and Operation -- Generally

It shall be unlawful for any person to operate or drive any vehicle at a speed greater than the speed designated or posted, or to overtake or pass any other vehicle in any school zone as it may be marked or designated within the City during the hours indicated upon signs erected in such school zone, or whenever children are present in such school zones, or when such school zones have an alternating flashing light in operation.

Sec. 10.125.2. School Zone Time

The School Zone Time during which school zone speed limits, one-way traffic patterns, and no parking regulations contained in this Section 10.125 shall be in effect is during the hours indicated upon signs erected in such school zone, or whenever children are present in such school zones, or when such school zones have an alternating flashing light in operation. The normal posted speed limit, traffic patterns and parking regulations shall apply outside the School Zone Time.

Sec. 10.125.3. Speed Limits

The following prima facie maximum speed limits hereinafter designated for motor vehicles are hereby determined and declared to be reasonable and safe. Such maximum speed limits are hereby fixed as the rate of speed for motor vehicles traveling upon the main street or highway, or parts of the main street or highway, and no motor vehicle shall be operated upon or along such portions of the named streets and highways

identified below in excess of the speeds set forth as follows during School Zone Times:

Sec. 10.125.6. School Zone Signage

The City Manager or his designee is hereby authorized to cause to be erected, appropriate signs indicating such school zones, reduced speed zones, one-way traffic patterns and no-parking areas.”

SECTION 3. Cumulative Repealer

This Ordinance shall be cumulative of all other Ordinances and shall not repeal any of the provisions of such Ordinances except for those instances where there are direct conflicts with the provisions of this Ordinance. Ordinances or parts thereof in force at the time this Ordinance shall take effect and that are inconsistent with this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent that they are inconsistent with this Ordinance. Provided however, that any complaint, action, claim or lawsuit which has been initiated shall continue to be governed by the provisions of such Ordinance and for that purpose the Ordinance shall remain in full force and effect.

SECTION 4. Savings

All rights and remedies of the City of Farmersville are expressly saved as to any and all violations of the provisions of any Ordinances which have accrued at the time of the effective date of this Ordinance; and, as to such accrued violations and all pending litigation, both civil and criminal, whether pending in court or not, under such Ordinances, same shall not be affected by this Ordinance but may be prosecuted until final disposition by the courts.

SECTION 5. Severability

It is hereby declared to be the intention of the City Council of the City of Farmersville that the phrases, clauses, sentences, paragraphs, and sections of this Ordinance are severable, and if any phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph, or section of this Ordinance should be declared unconstitutional by valid judgment or final decree of any court of competent jurisdiction, such unconstitutionality shall not affect any of the remaining phrases, clauses, sentences, paragraphs, or sections of this Ordinance, since the same would have been enacted by the City Council without incorporation in this Ordinance of any such unconstitutional phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph, or section.

SECTION 6. Governmental Immunity

All of the regulations provided in this ordinance are hereby declared to be governmental and for the health, safety and welfare of the general public. Any member of the City Council or any City official or employee charged with the enforcement of this ordinance, acting for the City of Farmersville in the discharge of his/her duties, shall not thereby render himself/herself personally liable; and he/she is hereby relieved from all personal liability for any damage that might accrue to persons or property as a result of any act required or permitted in the discharge of his/her said duties.

SECTION 7. Injunctions

Any violation of this ordinance can be enjoined by a suit filed in the name of the City of Farmersville in a court of competent jurisdiction, and this remedy shall be in addition to any penal provision in this ordinance or in the Code of the City of Farmersville.

SECTION 8. Engrossment and Enrollment

The City Secretary of the City of Farmersville is hereby directed to engross and enroll this Ordinance by copying the exact Caption and the Effective Date clause in the minutes of the City Council of the City of Farmersville and by filing this Ordinance in the Ordinance records of the City.

SECTION 9. Penalty

Any person, firm or corporation violating any of the provisions or terms of this Ordinance or of the Code of Ordinances as amended hereby, shall be subject to the same penalty as provided for in the Code of Ordinances of the City of Farmersville, as previously amended, and upon conviction shall be punished by a fine not to exceed the sum of Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) for each offense.

SECTION 10. Effective Date

The change in street names adopted by this Ordinance shall take effect upon the _____ day of _____, 20__.
