

## GENERAL GUIDELINES

- o You must place your household hazardous waste inside the bag. Do not overfill the bag.
- o Only the bag provided to you may be used.
- o Bag must be closed securely.
- o Do not drag the bag.
- o Place all electronics, auto batteries and fluorescent tubes in cardboard boxes outside the bag. Wrap fluorescent tubes together with tape if there are more than one. If available, use the original packaging to hold the tubes and stand them up to prevent breaking.
- o Do not fill bag with pool chemicals as this may start a fire

## THE COLLECTION KIT

The kit is comprised of a 30-gallon plastic bag, instruction sheet and labels for unlabeled containers.

We start with a 30-gallon plastic bag—



along with an instruction sheet, HHW label, and zip ties.



These items are then placed inside your HHW envelope.



Once packaged the kit is mailed right to you.



## IMPORTANT SAFETY REMINDERS

1. Never mix materials; there may be an adverse chemical reaction.
2. Keep materials in original containers if possible.
3. Always seal containers to prevent leakage.
4. Label any items that are not already clearly labeled.

## HOW TO USE THE KIT PROGRAM

Please remember, the maximum quantity of waste to be collected is limited to what will fit in the bag, with the exception of up to five auto batteries, five fluorescent tubes and/or CFL's and limited consumer electronics outside the bag. No single item may weigh more than 40 lbs. See list below.

### LIST OF TYPICAL ITEMS ELIGIBLE FOR COLLECTION:

<b>Aerosols</b> containing flammable or hazardous material such as paint	CRT (Computer Monitor)
<b>Art/Hobby Supplies</b> Adhesive, Paint, Cleaners, Correction Fluid, Photography, Chemicals	Television
<b>Automotive Products</b> Cleaners, Lubricant, Solvent, Fuel, Brake Fluid, Antifreeze, Carburetor Cleaner, Metal Conditioner, Engine Degreaser, Fuel Additives, Used Motor Oil, Used Oil Filters	CPU's, Laptop and Handheld Computers
<b>Automotive and Household</b>	Keyboard
<b>Botheries</b>	Printer
<b>Cleaners/Wax</b> Household/Auto Polish, Degreaser, Rug/Upholstery Cleaner, etc.	Mouse
<b>Flammables</b> Automotive/Household Solvent, Fuel, Paint, Lubricant, Kerosene, Charcoal Lighter Fluid, Mineral Spirit	<b>Examples of Peripheral Items</b> Related Cables or Wires CD-ROMS Remote Controls, Calculators VCRs CD Players, Stereos Scanners House Phones
<b>Lubricant</b> Automotive/Household Compressor Oil, Cutting Oil, Etc.	
<b>Other Household</b> Fluorescent Tubes/Bulbs, Compact Fluorescent Lamps (CFL), Thermometers (for mercury/for oral use not for breast milk)	
<b>Paint</b> Aerosols Hobby/Automotive/Household Latex and Oil-Based Paint Products including Primer, Lacquer, Unseal Oil, Primer, Stain, Varnish	
<b>Personal Products</b> Nail Polish, Polish Remover, Rubbing Alcohol, Shoe Polish, Spot Remover	
<b>Poison</b> Household/Garden Poison (insecticide, herbicide, fungicide), Bait, Fertilizer, etc.

## HHW/ USED ELECTRONICS COLLECTION TIMELINE

The following describes the collection process. Residents can call CWD's Customer Service Community at 972.392.9300



CWD's friendly customer service representatives will then collect the customer's address and information.



A HHW package is then put together to be mailed to the customers' place of residence.



## EASY & CONVENIENT



**THIS IS YOUR FRIENDLY REMINDER ITEMS WE WILL NOT COLLECT**  
Over loaded 30-gallon bags/items outside bag that are not in a cardboard box

Once the packet arrives the resident can then place their Household Hazardous Waste in their 30-gallon bag, seal, & label it.

CWD will arrive on pick up day to take away the material.



The material is then brought to CWD then disposed of properly.



## HOW TO PACK YOUR BAG

1. Check each container. If any do not have labels, use those provided or clearly mark the container. We cannot accept unknown materials.
2. If a container leaks, bag it and label it. Place all labeled items into the bag; do not overfill it.
3. Place used electronics, auto batteries and fluorescent bulbs, in cardboard boxes, next to the filled bag.

## WHEN & WHERE TO PLACE THE BAG

### ON COLLECTION DAY:

1. Place the secured bag near your entrance door, garage or other area near the front of your home. Do not place the bag in or near an alley, curb or street. Do not allow pets or children access to the bag.
2. Place the secured bag out for collection by 7:00 a.m. on the 3rd Thursday of each month.

### NOT ACCEPTABLE

Materials that WILL NOT be collected:
Sharps -including needles, lancets, pinned into a sealed rigid plastic container
Medicine
Ammunition
Explosives
Acetone
Any materials in unlabeled or leaking containers
No bulky items, gas/propane cylinders, tires, lamps, appliances, exercise equipment, etc.

We can only accept 40 lbs or less

### ACCEPTABLE

Examples of Acceptable Items that <b>MUST</b> be Placed Inside of the Bag	Examples of Items Which May Be Placed in cardboard boxes, Outside of the Bag
Poison	Auto Batteries (up to five)
Solvent	Fungicide
Oil-base & Latex Paint	Metal Polish
Aerosols	Moth Balls
Cleaners	Creosote
Gasoline	Used Motor Oil
Antifreeze	Used Electronic Waste
	Fluorescent Straight Tubes, CFL's (Combined total of no more than five)
	Television (one only)

All liquids must be in sealed, labeled containers of five gallons or less.
